# MIND+BODY+CHARACTER

Athlos Academy is a unique public charter school that prepares students for success in three ways.

## PREPARED MIND

**The Prepared Mind pillar at Athlos Academy of St. Cloud is centered on academic programs that will prime students with the knowledge and critical thinking skills they need to excel.**

### Academics—STAR Assessments

Students at Athlos (in grades 2–8) will take STAR assessments.

These are computer-adaptive tests that measure student achievement in reading and math skills. As a student takes the assessment, the assessment selects items based on the student's responses. If the student answers the item correctly, the assessment increases the difficulty level of the next item. If the student answers incorrectly, the assessment lowers the difficulty level of the next item. By continually adjusting the difficulty of an item to what the student has shown she can or cannot do, the assessment is tailored to accurately measure each student's level of achievement. Students will take STAR tests three times per year. These typically take 20 minutes to administer.

Teachers will receive instant results/feedback and create their teaching plans from the reports generated.

Parents can expect to receive a report with their child's data.

### EL Update: ACCESS Testing

Welcome back to all students at AASC! The main goal of the EL department is to support student's language development until students can exit the EL program. We are excited to share that during the 2018–2019 school year, 18 students qualified to exit the EL program!

During the month of September, EL teachers will be busy screening new students and determining service levels for all of our exiting EL students. We are excited to start the new school year and helping our students further develop their language proficiency.



### Title Program

Greetings from your Title I Team,

The month of September sure is a busy one. The Title I team is currently spending time with benchmark assessments using a new universal screen, DIBELS. We will provide assessments in the areas of letter name, sounds, word identification, reading fluency, and reading comprehension. This screen will help not only the teachers, but also parents to understand if students are on track or in need of extra support. Students who are identified as needing Title I support will be invited to participate starting in October.

# HEALTHY BODY

**The Healthy Body pillar allows students of all athletic abilities to participate in professionally developed, age-appropriate fitness curriculum.**

The first few weeks in athletic movement class are all about getting reacquainted with coaches, students, and friends, combined with lots of movement! # PERFORMANCE CHARACTER

**The Performance Character pillar is the foundation of school culture and promotes 12 key character traits: Grit, Leadership, Social Intelligence, Creativity, Courage, Energy/Zest, Initiative, Curiosity, Integrity, Optimism, Humility, and Focus/Self Control.**

Welcome back for a fun-filled year of Performance Character!

The first two weeks of the month, we are focusing on getting back to our roots, Athlos roots. Every person in this building brings a unique experience with them and we want to make sure we celebrate those differences to bring our school closer together. Our differences are what we all have in common and that is fantastic! Once our students learn how our differences actually show how similar we are, we will build on that foundation by introducing the first of our 12 character traits: **Leadership, Humility, Initiative, and Focus/Self Control.**

Building character in the early years of students' lives has a long-term positive impact.

Moral development and character formation extends at least as far back as Aristotle's Nichomachean Ethics and Socrates' Meno and continues through to modern times (Nucci, 1989). In the last several hundred years, character education has been seen as a primary function of educational institutions.

In recent decades, character development has taken a backseat in priorities on many different levels. For this reason, it is exciting Athlos makes such a priority on character development.

# Athlos Academy of St. Cloud Students See Increases in Math and Reading Scores

We are proud to share the news that our school has seen an increase in math and reading proficiency from 2018. For the second year in a row, students who were enrolled in Athlos Academy of St. Cloud for a longer period of time grew more academically than their peers in neighboring St. Cloud schools.

The recent release of Minnesota Department of Education's North Star accountability results show an increase in math and reading proficiency for Athlos Academy of St. Cloud students, while Minnesota State proficiency scores and St. Cloud proficiency scores, overall, saw decreases in math and reading proficiency.

Minnesota Department of Education's North Star accountability system uses five key indicators to assess a school's success. These indicators are: academic achievement based on MCA scores; progress to proficiency for English-learners; academic progress from one year to the next; graduation rates over four or seven years; and consistent attendance.

Athlos Academy of St. Cloud showed growth in all factors of the North Star accountability system, with highlights of student and school success including:

- Athlos Academy of St. Cloud was only one of two schools in St. Cloud to increase proficiency in math and reading from 2018 to 2019. While locally in St. Cloud, math and reading proficiency decreased by close to one percent, Athlos Academy of St. Cloud students saw an increase in math proficiency of six percent and an increase in reading proficiency of four percent from 2018 to 2019.
- More Athlos Academy of St. Cloud English-language-learners met their individual learning targets, from 124 in 2018 to 138 in 2019.
- Average attendance at Athlos Academy of St. Cloud increased two percent from 2018 to 2019.
