

Truancy Policy

Student Policy 5202 Approved: 1/25/2016

Revised: 8/7/2017

I. PURPOSE

School attendance is crucial to student achievement, and Athlos Academy's policy aims to encourage attendance by delineating the consequences of accumulated unexcused absences.

II. POLICY

- A. After the 3 accumulated unexcused absences in a school year, a student's parent or guardian will be notified by certified mail that his or her child is nearing the total of unexcused absences allowed by the county.
- B. After such notification, the student or his or her parent or guardian may, within a reasonable time, request a conference with school officials regarding the student's absences and the prescribed discipline.
 - 1. The notification will state that the school strongly urges the student's parent or guardian to request such a conference if needed.
- C. In accordance with Minnesota Statute, if there continues to be unexcused absences, the school shall report to parents/ guardians and county when the total number of unexcused absences reaches truant levels.
 - 1. If the child is 11 years old and under, the student will be referred to the appropriate county for possible educational child neglect.
 - 2. Students age 12 and over will be referred for possible truancy.
 - 3. The respective counties will correspond with families as outlined below:
 - a. Sherburne: Initial Truancy letter: 3 unexcused.
 - b. Stearns: Initial Truancy letter: 5 unexcused
 - c. Benton: Initial Truancy letter: 7 unexcused.
 - Unexcused absences following referrals to the county will be documented and recorded by the School
 Officials.
 - These documents will be issued to the county which may be followed by additional meetings and/ or court hearings.
- D. In cases of recurring unexcused absences, the administration may also request the county attorney to file a petition with the juvenile court, pursuant to Minnesota statutes.
